Dear Members and Friends of Union Presbyterian Church,

One of my favorite poems from American Poet, William Baer, is titled "Adam." It speculates on Adam's thoughts after the death of his son, Able.

#### **ADAM**

[Genesis 4:8]

Of course, he'd seen this "thing" before, but never

like this. After Eden, he'd found a swan

lying motionless and silent forever,

rotting, irretrievable, and gone.

But now it's his boy, the brother of Cain,

the shepherd son, the kind and faithful friend

of He-Who-Is, lying quiet and slain:

finished, futureless, at the end of his end.

Once, Adam had named the names, and named his own

two sons, and named this curse, which nullifies

and terminates, as "death." But he who'd known

the awesome power of God looked to the skies,

knowing, without a doubt, though nothing was said,

his God both could and would undo the dead.

So, do you think it is possible? Is it possible that Adam had no doubts that one day God could and would undo the dead? On the one hand, as Christians we believe that God is incomprehensible. When considering the qualities of God, how could we ever hope to truly understand him? In "None Greater: The Undomesticated Attributes of God," Matthew Barrett writes that Scripture passages like Isaiah 40 point out that God is not different from us just in terms of degree but that God is different in kind. "He is the creator, not the created... He is not placed into the hands of the creature, but holds every person- even entire nations!- in the palm of his hand. He is not limited to a specific place... but transcends any one place and is everyone at once with his whole being... There is no one like God. He is unsearchable."

God may not be comprehensible by us, but he is knowable. God is knowable because he wants to be known and has made himself known to us. Barrett quotes John Calvin to explain the main way we can come to know God. Trying to understand God's essence will just lead to failure. So instead of trying to grasp God's greatness, "we ought to gaze upon his works, that we may be restored by his goodness." Barrett writes that God's works, not his essence, is what allows us to come to know God. That's why we study Scripture isn't it? We come to understand who God is better, by reading about what he did in creation, what he did through the people of Israel, what he did by sending his Son, and what he does through the church. We come to know "who" God is by what he does.

So, could Adam have known that God both could and would one day undo death? Maybe... Adam experienced the creative power of God personally with the creation of Eve. He experienced the perfect world God wanted to provide for humanity in Eden. He knew what it was like to live sin free and with no fear of death. It's implied that Adam may have even walked regularly with God in the Garden. Adam experienced God in a way none of us have. Did Adam know that God COULD undo death? Definitely! Did Adam know that God WOULD one day undo death? Well, at the very least he knew that sin and death was not God's intention for the world and humanity. Knowing who God was by his actions, as Adam sat with his son's remains, Adam very well may have understood that death was only a temporary reality.

May each of us also continue to get to know God better through his works (as we read about it in Scripture and experience it in our lives). May it help us grow in confidence of God. Maybe our faith, hope, and trust in God might even rival Adam's (as he is portrayed in this poem).

### PROBLEMS WITH NEWSLETTER BULK MAIL

Since January, we've had problems with 3 of the 5 newsletter bulk mailings. In May it was 3 weeks late,

one month 2/3rd of the newsletters were sent back to the church, and another time about 1/2 of them never reached their destination. We are not trying to throw the Post Office under the bus. There are lovely people working there, we know about their staffing issues, and that they are trying to integrate a new payment computer program. That said, we also want to be good stewards of the money given to the church (part of which is being used to mail the Newsletter each month). For several years now C&T has looked at whether there was a better option for mailing newsletters. For a church our size, there really isn't. So, we are going to try three things to deal with this issue.



- (1) Starting with the July Newsletter, we are going to send the newsletter out earlier. For this to work we will need people to get their newsletter articles in earlier. Each month, you will need your articles in by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month. This means that July Newsletter articles will need to be in by June 15<sup>th</sup>.
- (2) Jennifer will be tweaking the newsletter online format to make it more "online-reading" friendly.
- (3) Stacks of newsletters will be available to pick up at the doors of the sanctuary the first couple weeks of the month.

For the next few months, we will continue to bulk mail the newsletter, but we challenge you to "try out" reading the newsletter online and picking it up on Sunday. We will send out a phone tree message when the newsletter is available to pick up or read online (and those of you who receive those messages with email or text will be able to link directly to the online version from the message).

Could we eventually move away from the cost of mailing the newsletter thru inconsistent bulk mailings and just send it to a handful who need it mailed? Let's find out!
